

Gilmer County Saddle Club  
2011 Membership Points Rules

1. In order to be eligible for Gilmer County Saddle Club Points Championship, you must be a member of the Gilmer County Saddle Club prior to the first show of the season and be a member in good standing with the club in accordance with the Gilmer County Saddle Club By-Laws.
2. Only points earned from the Gilmer County Saddle Club Shows will be counted towards the Points Championship in each division. No points from any other shows will be allowed.
3. The individual and horse that has the most points by division at the end of the season will be the winner of the Points Championship. Below are the following divisions:
  - a. English
  - b. Running
  - c. Racking
  - d. Western
  - Note: If an individual is the points champion in more than one division, it will be the choice of the individual as to which division they would choose to accept the belt buckle. They would still be recognized as the winner in that said division but will only be eligible to win one belt buckle.

4. Points will be awarded based on the number of entries in every class. Example- If there are 7 entries, 1<sup>st</sup> place would be awarded 7 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> place would be awarded 6 points, 3<sup>rd</sup> place would be awarded 5 points etc. with 7<sup>th</sup> place in this example getting 1 point. In classes that are non-timed events, the judging will be awarded for all entries. However, ribbons will only be awarded for 1<sup>st</sup> place thru 5<sup>th</sup> place.
5. The Points Championship results will be posted on the web site by individual and horse no later than one week after the show.
6. In order to be eligible for Point Championship, the member must meet the work requirement or 20 hours as stated in the by-laws.
7. At the end of the season, winners will be announced at the Christmas Dinner. Therefore, they will not be posted on the website until after the Christmas Dinner.
